## 4. Nomination and Application Procedure

<b>Nomination</b>	<p>Qualified students will be selected and nominated by our partner universities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▶ Name, Gender, Nationality, Date of Birth(MM/DD/YYYY), Email Address, Desired department/major of Study, and intended Term of Study etc.</li> <li>▶ No minimum language score or CGPA requirement from GWNU, but respect a partner university's nomination criteria.</li> </ul>
<b>Application</b>	<p>Incoming Exchange students should prepare required documents as following order below. (see '5. Application Documents' table below)</p>
<b>Acceptance</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▶ An official acceptance package will be sent to accepted students, containing an Acceptance Letter, Certificate of Admission, and visa documents [D-2]</li> <li>▶ Accepted students are advised to wait to make travel plans and embassy/consulate visits until they have received their official acceptance package.</li> </ul>

<b>Visa Type</b>	Student Visa [D-2]

<b>Required documents</b>	GWNU Certificate of Admission ※ The regulations for obtaining a visa are subject to change. ※ Extra documents such as a certificate of registration may be requested.

## 7. Health Insurance

<b>Insurance Type</b>	Korean National Health Insurance
<b>General Information</b>	Mandatory nation-wide insurance for all international students including exchange students staying in Korea for more than 3 months. Required to purchase even with a similar insurance coverage from a student's home country. Keep in mind that those who completed the alien registration will be eligible for the service.
<b>Cost</b>	USD 70/ monthly
<b>Coverage</b>	<p>Various including the following benefits</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Dental treatment</li> <li>- Oriental medical treatment</li> <li>- Pregnancy and childbirth-related medical expenses</li> <li>- Outpatient medical service: 30~60%, varies by medical care institution type and area</li> <li>- Hospitalization expenses: 20%</li> <li>- Beneficiaries pay part of the medical expenses</li> <li>- The insured is not required to claim benefits after receiving treatment</li> <li>- Number and amount of benefits are not limited</li> </ul>
<b>Non-coverage</b>	Treatment for diseases that do not affect work or daily life (e.g. plastic surgery, dental etc)

## 8. Airport Pick-up Service

- ▶ On a predetermined date, we offer a free airport pick-up service for exchange students arriving in Gangneung.
- ▶ Before students purchase flight ticket, they first need to communicate with GWNU's exchange program coordinator in order to arrange pick-up date. Exchange students must inform the exchange coordinator of their flight information immediately once they purchase flight ticket.
- ▶ Pick-up team cannot wait for the students who do not make it the designated place on time. If you miss the pick-up team, please use public transportation to come to Gangneung and check in a dormitory.

<b>Global Mate Program</b>	International students will be paired with current GWNNU students who will help with the transition period as well as their academic achievement. This may be a beginning of a life-long friendship.
<b>Cultural Excursions</b>	A day trip around suburban areas of Gangneung and Gangwon State will allow students to indulge into Korean culture, cuisine, interact with the locals, and experience difference aspects of Korean culture and history.
<b>Korean Cultural Experience Program</b>	This program is a planning or organizing cultural trip to Korea by building a team. It is a Korean language and culture program designed for students not only to develop their Korean skills but also discover Korea's must-visit attractions and sites during summer or winter break. At the end of this program, you will develop your team management skills, interpersonal skills and improve cross-cultural understanding and communication skills.
